Why run this pilot?

- ADD focus includes Young Persons with Disabilities
- Youth advocacy initiatives can contribute to disability movement
- But often difficult for them to access funds and influence decisions
- Innovation in grantmaking aims to change the status quo
- Innovation in advocacy campaigns aims to generate new impacts



Advocacy and Grantmaking led by Youth with Disabilities

Youth-led Advocacy Campaigns

- You decide what you want to change, and you lead your work
- Use this workshop to develop your ideas, connections and proposals
- . We provide support and foster peer to peer learning during implementation

Youth-led Grantmaking

- Small pot of funds available total of 5 million TSH for spending July-December 2023
- All youth at the workshop will discuss how to use this money
- And elect a Youth Grants Task Team to make final decisions and support learning



How this will happen: Day 1 & 2 of workshop

To plan an Advocacy Campaign – Get the primer

- Think what do you want to change, how, who must you work with (here, outside)?
- Learn and connect **challenge and widen** your thinking and connections

To be part of the Youth Grants Task Team – Get the Terms of Reference

- Listen what are the **priorities** for change and what approaches might be most **effective**
- Think what **learning and mentorship** will most help young campaigners with disabilities

How will happen? After the workshop...

After the workshop: continue to develop proposals

- Deadline for proposal submission: 14th May 2023
- . Final proposals selection and contracting: June
- Implementation support period: 6 months (July December 2023)
 - Mentorships and regular on-line meet-ups,
 - Final learning session in December.



Advocacy campaign grants: Who can apply?

- Youth with disabilities attending this Festival from Tanzania
 - Aged 35 or younger
 - No experience required

- Groups (organisations, networks, platforms etc) or groups of groups or individuals
- Working together in the same or different places
- You are encouraged to involve people/groups beyond this festival

Young women with disabilities are encouraged to apply



Youth Grants Task Team: Who can apply?

- . Also youth with disabilities attending this Festival who live and work in Tanzania
 - Aged 35 or younger

- Interested in grantmaking and supporting learning no experience required!
- NOTE: You <u>cannot</u> apply for a grant and be on the Task Team it is one <u>OR</u> the other!
- Young women with disabilities are encouraged to apply
